AGRONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

The Midwest Seed Mixture contains annuals and perennials for ornamental landscaping in the midwestern U.S. and south central Canada. This area includes IL, IN, IA, eastern KS, KY, MI, MN, MO, eastern NE, OH, WI, and the southern halves of Manitoba and Ontario. Flowers will provide color throughout the growing season.

SUGGESTED USAGE

Garden beds, borders, and meadow gardening.

ESTABLISHMENT GUIDELINES

The best time to plant depends on climate. For cool climates, plant in the springafter the last frost, early summer or fall. A smooth, weed and vegetation free planting bed is important for good seed to soil contact and prompt germination. For smaller areas, seed can be broadcast by hand or use of a drop or cyclone spreader. Mix seed with a carrier such as sand or vermiculite. For larger areas, a drill or hydroseeder is effective. When hydroseeding, a 2-step process is recommended. For irrigated sites, keep seeded area consistently moist for 4-6 weeks and then gradually reduce watering. In arid climates or during drought conditions, provide up to ½ inch of supplemental water per week or during the growing season.

RECOMMENDED MAINTENANCE PRACTICES

Weeds should be sprayed or pulled as soon as they can be identified. Monitor moisture levels in order to maintain optimal growth and flowering. The area may be cut or mowed in the fall following seed set. Mow to a height of 4-6 inches. Overseeding can be done each season in order to provide additional annuals or to fill in bare spots.
